

TinyLife Presentation

As a school, we are delighted to announce that we have achieved the 'TinyLearners Award.'

One of only ten schools in Northern Ireland, staff have recently completed training using a resource – 'Preterm Birth Information for Educational Professionals'. This training outlines the impact that premature birth MAY have on a child's development and learning as well as their physical, emotional and social development. It also offers practical ways to support children at school who have been born prematurely. With an average of 2-3 children in every



classroom being born prematurely we recognise that being Prem Aware is important. In Fairview we want to be able to support these pupils in their educational journey.


